

### **Anthony Low (1927-2015)**

The editorial board of *The Round Table* regrets to announce the death on 11 February 2015 of Professor (Donald) Anthony Low, historian, university administrator, frequent contributor to the journal, former chairman of its editorial board, and longstanding member of its international advisory board.

Educated at Haileybury College and Exeter College, Oxford, his first post was at Makerere College, Kampala, from 1951, and it was there that he began his long association with *The Round Table*, as the journal's notably progressive East Africa correspondent for much of the 1950s. His subsequent, highly distinguished academic career took him to the ANU in Canberra as a senior fellow (1959-64), the University of Sussex, as Professor of History and founding Dean of the School of African and Asian Studies (1964-72), back to the ANU as Professor of History (1973-83) and Vice-Chancellor (1975-82), the University of Cambridge as Smuts Professor of the History of the British Commonwealth (1983-7) and President of Clare Hall (1987-94), and finally in retirement back to the ANU as a University Fellow. He was the author of many acclaimed books on East African and South Asian history, and on aspects of British imperial and of Commonwealth history. He served as chairman of the editorial board of *The Round Table* from 1992 to 1994, and in retirement was an active member of its international advisory board.
